### **Childrens' Sermon**

#### **The Lessons**

Lamentations 3:21-33

This I call to mind,

#### 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

As you excel in everything-- in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you-- so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.

I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something-- now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has-- not according to what one does not have. I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance. As it is written,

"The one who had much did not have too much,  
and the one who had little did not have too little."

Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the sea. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, “My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live.” So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, “If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well.” Immediately her hemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, “Who touched my clothes?” And his disciples said to him, “You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, ‘Who touched me?’”

He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.”

While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader’s house to say, “Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?” But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, “Do not fear, only believe.” He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, “Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping.” And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child’s father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. He took her by the hand and said to her, “Talitha cum,” which means, “Little girl, get up!” And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

*Celebrant and People*

We remember Christ's death, We proclaim Christ's resurrection, We await Christ's coming in glory;  
Celebrant: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Savior of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, through whom we are acceptable to you, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [blessed David and] all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Savior, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

## GOOD NEWS OF ST. DAVID'S CHURCH

**Safe Church training:** There are some opportunities coming up to complete either universal or specialized Safe Church training, in person as well as by Zoom. More information on dates and which training you may need are on the diocesan website at [diosova.org/safe-church/](http://diosova.org/safe-church/).

**Wednesday eucharist:** Each Wednesday at 10am, join us for eucharist with healing prayers.

**Pastor Carleton's office hours:** I will have bi-weekly "office hours" for a time at St. David's and have put a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board with four different one-hour blocks for folks to come in and touch base, starting with 11am on Wednesday, July 10. You can put your own name on the list or call Connie and have her do it (or communicate with me; text at 757-871-8461 or email at [carletonbakkum@cox.net](mailto:carletonbakkum@cox.net)).

What to talk about? *Anything! What it's like to experience Elizabeth's departure. Your own faith journey. A regret or grief or hope or plan or thorny theological issue. I want to come to know the people of St. David's.*

For each session, we'll begin with a brief silence then talk and close with a prayer. Low key. Congregational life seems to unfold one conversation at a time.

**Mini-ministries:** Would you like to get more involved in our church activities but not quite sure what yet?? Please think about these mini-ministries. They don't require training or much time.

Ushers—easy, easy, easy!! Take up the collection plate and usher people up for the Eucharist, hand out bulletins, and take a count of attending.

Host/Hostess—provide simple coffee hour nibbles (doesn't have to be fancy) and act as host for the brief get together after the 10am service. Great way to get to know people.

Greeter—greet people as they come in for services. Hand out bulletins and welcome newcomers with info on our service.

Choir—do you enjoy singing??? Please think about joining our choir. You don't need to read music, just have fun singing.

HomeAgain Men's Shelter Meal—do you enjoy cooking and have a good recipe that can serve the 18 -20 men staying at the downtown shelter? Meals are simply dropped off and the men staying there come out to unload the meal. Drivers to deliver the meal are needed. There would be someone to go with you the first time to show you where it is located. It is always the 3rd Monday of each month.

Delivery driver—Delivers the food over to the CCHASM food pantry.

**Outreach– CCHASM:** This is an organization here in Chesterfield County that partners with Departments of Social Services and faith communities to assist those who are experiencing severe financial stress. One of the main resources they have is a network of community food banks where they refer their clients who struggle to put food on the table.

The food bank where we take our donations is at Southminster Presbyterian Church on Hull Street. They are in constant need of donations and are currently asking for these items: protein bars, bottled juice, saltines, cannellini or other canned beans, stew, soup, Spam, tuna, and shampoos. Think about picking up a can or item on this list for the food bank. The collection baskets are in the narthex for your donations.

We could also use another person to deliver the food to Southminster. It is not far away and they have a cart that is rolled out to put the food on so it's super easy and doesn't take much time.
